Ancient Inspiration



Travel back in time to see examples of quilt patterns going back to the middle ages along with information about the evolution of quilt making over the years. Flying Geese, Sawtooth, Birds in the air are just a few of today's quilt blocks that can be seen in ancient mosaics and architecture.



Workshop 4/5 (9-4) Jazzy Zippered Pouch

Jazz up that purse, iron tote, bag, quilt, shirt (the list can go on and on) with custom-made woven fabric. It's surprisingly easy to do and worth the effort. Students will learn how to weave 1" wide strips of raw edge fabric to create a whole new unique piece of fabric that will be used to make a zippered pouch. Thread Embellishment adds the final pizzazz.

May

Take a humorous look at the quilter's nature to multiply. Peek into the inner sanctum of quilter's stashes. If you love fabric and need to find creative ways to manage and get control over your stash, this is for you.

Workshop 5/3 – Machine Applique for the Modern Quilter

Learn Annie's way to beautiful machine applique and take the fear out of the "A" word. Start by making your own pieced fabric, then create large scale motifs that are easy to embellish with decorative stitches. Annie will share all of her tips for successful machine applique, and the shallow

learning curve for amazing applique - which is raw-edge, fusible and stitched. P.S. You can do it and be happy with your project!



June

Norene Skies "Use it All, You Paid for It"



Zoom Lecture & Trunk Show -

Quilters are the curators of extensive textile collections and should use their materials wisely, without waste. Norene will explain how she organizes her collection and scraps, her techniques as well as ideas for using all your scrap fabric and batting. She will show how her scrap quilting has progressed including how she up-cycles old quilt blocks and clothing. She is a firm believer that you should use it all since you paid for it. The lecture is centered on the Reduce, Reuse, & Recycle theme.

Norene is a retired public school Library Media Specialist and Nationally Board Certified Teacher. She learned to sew at an early age, made mainly garments until 1995 when she began quilting. She has quilted nearly everyday since retiring. Starting as a traditional quilter, she dabbled in art quilting, and is now a scrap quilter who tends toward modern improv. She thinks creating is as necessary as breathing.

June 7 - 6 Hour Zoom Workshop 9am-4pm Scrappy Improv 4 Ways – Quilt as You Go

Learn four different techniques to make "Quilt As You Go" scrappy improv blocks that include endless variations. You will also learn to use your fabric and batting

scraps to make blocks that will be joined by 2"sashing and how to "add a border". This technique can be used on countless types of quilts making your domestic machine quilting easier to handle and quilt. The "add a border" makes the back of your quilt perfectly centered and bordered.

Teresa Duryea Wong The Calling of Quilt Collector



Quilt collectors play a critical role in the circle of life of art. By purchasing a quilt, the work of the artist is immediately validated, and the quilt obtains a monetary value that didn't exist before. The collector also has a critical role in preserving quilts, and ideally, presenting them to viewers, either by hanging it in their home, or loaning it to museums. This lecture will explore the collections of major antique quilt collectors such as Joanna Rose, Eli Leon, and Robert & Ardis James --- and why their vision and passion are so important to quilt preservation. Learn how 651 red and white quilts belonging to Joanna Rose revolutionized quilt exhibitions in 2011, and how one quiet collector living in a small home amassed an enormous collection of African American quilts. Plus, how 1,000 quilts from the James' founded the world's finest quilt collection and museum in Lincoln, Nebraska. In addition, you'll be introduced to the collections of contemporary art quilt collectors Frank Klein, Marvin Fletcher, and Jack Walsh. Lastly, hear tips on how to have your own quilts acquired by collectors or museums.

2023 BVQG BEATLES CHALLENGE

This year's BVQG member challenge will be to create a quilt representing your favorite Beatle, favorite Beatles' song, a line in a Beatles' song, favorite Beatles' album, a Beatles' concert attended or anything Beatles related.

- 1. <u>Entry Must Be a Quilt:</u> defined as having a fabric top layer, batting middle layer and a fabric bottom layer; joined together by quilting with edges finished, e.g., binding, facing, etc.
- 2. **Entry Must Be a NEW Quilt:** Entry must be a new quilt, created in 2023 specifically for this challenge. Any technique may be used in creating your quilt, e.g., piecing, applique, collage, etc.
- 3. **Size:** Entries may be any size but may <u>not</u> be larger than 60 inches x 60 inches.
- 4. <u>Artist's Statement:</u> Members will submit a written statement with their quilt explaining what your quilt represents, what inspired you or just a simple explanation of your entry.
- 5. <u>Labels:</u> Any labels attached to your quilt that identify you as the maker must be covered before submitted.
- 6. <u>Due:</u> Entries are due at the November 7, 2023 Monthly Guild Meeting at Village on Antioch. Bring your quilt in an unmarked bag that your quilt cannot be seen through. You will sign in your quilt with the Challenge Committee.
- 7. **Voting:** A voting form (Google doc) containing a photo of each quilt along with its artist's statement will be emailed to every member on November 24. Members will vote on this form for their choice for 1st place (3 points), 2nd place (2 points), and 3rd place (1 point). Voting will run November 24-December 1. Entries will be displayed and winners announced at the December 5, 2023 Holiday Party.
- **8. Prizes:** First, second and third place prizes will be awarded based upon number of points received. In the case of a tie, the committee will ask a non-member to break the tie. Prizes will be gift cards to local quilt shops and amounts will be announced once a new budget is set for 2023
