



PAULA DOYLE

GREEN MOUNTAIN QUILTS

Magna Carta Quilts & Mini Mosaic Quilts

Paula has been a full time quilter for over 25 years, and enjoys all aspects of quilt making, from hand piecing to machine quilting, to designing quilt patterns and writing quilting books under the Green Mountain Quilt Studio label, in Surrey, England. She is the author of Mini Mosaic Quilts (C&T Publishing 2012),



which is all about making small scale quilts and blocks with a fantastic easy piecing technique, and <u>Easy Stack Quilts</u> (C&T Publishing 2018), which is all about making easy kaleidoscopic quilts using large scale printed fabrics.

Despite being born in Massachussetts, Paula spent her childhood in Brazil, the daughter of Methodist Missionary teachers. After a career in banking, Paula took up quilting full time in 1992. In 1995 she opened Green Mountain Quilts, a shop dedicated to the art and craft of quiltmaking, where she taught quilting and



patchwork classes. After 13 years in business she closed the shop in 2008, and since then has concentrated on designing quilt patterns, making quilts, filming video tutorials for Just Hands-on TV and for YouTube. Paula works from her garden studio at home on the banks of the beautiful River Thames in Surrey, England.

She loves traditional patterns as well as modern quilts, and she loves using new tools and materials to make the job simpler and more enjoyable.

In 2013 Paula was approached to design and create a quilt project to celebrate the 800th anniversary of the sealing of the Magna Carta at nearby Runnymede, where the terms of the Magna Carta were set forth and agreed between King John and his Barons in 1215. This resulted in the formation of the Magna Carta Quilt Association, and the Magna Carta Quilters, a group of 25 talented quilters who produced a series of 8 quilts for the anniversary festivities at Royal Holloway University. The Magna Carta Quilts have since been on display in Houston and Chicago as well as other venues around the UK, and are now in the permanent collection of The Quilters Guild of the British Isles.

2023 BVQG Beatles Challenge

This is it! Your Beatles Challenge Quilts are due at the <u>November 7th</u> Guild Meeting. Five were turned in at last month's meeting & we hope to receive many more in November. Here's what you need to do:

Cover the label on the back of your quilt; just baste a scrap of fabric over it.

Hanging sleeves are not required.

Bring it in a bag that cannot be seen through.

Include your printed or typed information about your quilt:

Name of your quilt.

What inspired you?

Your personal story about your quilt.

Did you make it for someone special?

Anything else you want others to know about your quilt.

Sign your quilt in with Jane Miller & Gayla Spurlock at the Beatles Challenge table. Your quilt will be very well cared for in a pet-free, smoke-free home.

Quilts will be stored flat. Please inform us of any other special handling instructions.

We have not heard from any members mailing quilts but if so, hopefully they are already on the way. Some helpful quidelines:

Photograph it and mail it with insurance and tracking.

When completing the insurance form, we recommend you identify it as a BLANKET, not a QUILT, per advice given by professional quilters.

Mail it to Gayla Spurlock at the address listed in the Membership Directory on Facebook. Send Gayla a text or email so your quilt will be expected. Cell # and email are also in the Facebook Membership Directory.

VOTING:

Non-KS/MO members & snowbirds already gone will receive an email & photos of the quilts for voting. KS/MO members will vote in person at the December meeting.

As Jane announced at our August Meeting, we will put aside our quilters' hats & vote from our hearts. This means you won't be voting based upon skill of workmanship, but rather voting based upon the quilt that makes you laugh, brings a tear to your eye or moves you in some other way. You will vote for one quilt...your FAVORITE. First, second, & third places will still be awarded.







SNOWFLAKE BLOCK BLOCK EXCHANGE

BVQG members can make snowflake blocks for our block exchange amongst members. You can make one or as many blocks as you like. For each block turned, in your name will be entered into a drawing to receive enough blocks to make a small quilt.


Colors for the snowflake blocks must be blues (from any shades of midnight to baby blue), whites, and metallic silver.



Key 12" x 12" finished (12-1/2" x 12 1/2" unfinished)

Two Color Snowflake 1 Block


FABRIC REQUIREMENTS: This block finished is 12" x 12" (12-1/2" x 12-1/2" Unfinished). The block can be made from TWO Fat Quarters or scraps of the same two fabrics. The color scheme for these blocks are blues, whites or metallic silver. PLEASE NO GRAY!!! The pattern shows using a blue for the snowflake and white background. It is your choice as to which color is used for which element




Snowflake Block 1 - G/H Units



How to piece the G and H patches together to create the G/H Unit.



- With right sides together, place one square H at top right corner of G.
- Mark a diagonal line corner to corner (dotted line).
- Sew on the dotted line -or- hint, hint... sew just outside the dotted line (to the right) for a more accurate size unit. This slight change gives back the few threads used by the fold.
- Trim excess leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (dashed line).
- Press to the dark fabric regardless if the dark is G or H.





- With right sides together, place one square H at bottom left corner of G.
- Mark a diagonal line corner to corner (dotted line).
- Sew on the dotted line –or hint, hint... sew just outside the dotted line (to the left) for a more accurate size unit. This slight change gives back the few threads used by the fold.
- Trim excess leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (dashed line).
- Press to the dark fabric. Trim H/G Unit to 3-1/2" x 3-1/2".




Make 4 G/H Units.

When laying out the squares, rectangles and units to piece together the Snowflake 1 block, turn the **G/H Units** as needed to create the diagonal cross. See the piecing layouts below.






Key 12" x 12" finished (12-1/2" x 12 1/2" unfinished)

Two Color Snowflake 2 Block

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS This block finished is 12" x 12" (12-1/2" x 12-1/2" Unfinished). The block can be made from TWO Fat Quarters or scraps of the same two fabrics. The color scheme for these blocks are blues, whites or metallic silver. PLEASE NO GRAY!!! The pattern shows using a blue for the snowflake and white background. It is your choice as to which color is used for which element. This pattern requires eight (8) 2" finished (2-1/2" unfinished) Half Square Triangles (HSTs). The cutting instructions show cutting for two popular methods but feel free to use whatever method you choose! If making oversize HSTs, after piecing trim the HST to 2-1/2" x 2-1/2".



Can vary in size by 1/2 inch

background fabric should measure 12 1/2" square






