Non-Resident Members (living outside of KS \& MO) \& All Snow Birds: A voting form (Google doc) containing a photo of each quilt along with its artist's statement will be emailed to non-resident guild members \& all snow birds on November 24. These members will vote on this form for their choice for 1 st place (3 points), 2nd place (2 points), and 3rd place (1 point). These voting forms are due back by email by December 1.
